





CAMBODIA NEXT STEPS FEATURE: SOPHEAK

Sopheak grew up an orphan at Bileg Solid Rock orphanage in Kampong Thom, Cambodia. She met her soon-to-be Parent Partner Jennifer Lelande in 2014 when she was 16 years old and Jenn came to the orphanage on a mission trip with Saving Susan. Jenn had a special connection with Sopheak and they bonded quickly. Sopheak was mature, and Jenn thought she was one of the staff, but soon found out that she was one of the orphans and sensed in her a lack of family and the love that comes with being chosen. Jenn was too young to Parent Partner Sopheak by herself, and her parents came alongside her to share in the commitment. Since that time, Jenn and Sopheak call each other best friends and sisters. They have talked weekly over video calls for years and grew even closer through visits to Cambodia, including a recent one in September 2019.

When Jenn married her husband, Ben, he also came alongside her in the Parent Partner journey. Sopheak is now entering her third year at Royal College in Phnom Penh and studying to be a teacher on a full scholarship through the Next Steps Program. When she first entered university, it was very difficult for her. Phnom Penh was a new, big, overwhelming city. She felt lonely and discouraged and called Jenn frequently for support and encouragement. Jenn helped her get through this difficult time and Sopheak is now flourishing. She is a fantastic student, and gives back to her orphanage home when she heads back during her holiday breaks. When there she helps the kids with their studies, translates English on Parent Partner calls, and helps wherever she can.


MARCH 29-APRIL 4

Effects of Abandonment



Sobering Statistics

60-85% of children in human trafficking in the U.S. come from the foster care system. 260,000 of the 16 million people in Cambodia are trapped in sex slavery. In Guatemala, nearly 60% of the 50,000 victims of sex trafficking are children.

Genesis' clients each received a handwritten thank-you note from these children.








